Emeritus College instructor and award winning Burbank pastelist Bruce Trentham will instruct a fun one day plein air landscape workshop. **All mediums are welcome.** The workshop will be at **Deukmejian Wilderness Park, 3429 Markridge Road, La Crescenta, California 91214.**

Army he worked in New York City as a commercial artist and also created free-lance illustrations for various magazines. In 1960 he moved to Southern California where he worked for ad agencies and commercial art studios. After leaving the commercial art world he has devoted himself to painting pictures in both watercolor and oil.

Dick Heimbold (bottom photo, page 1) started a lifetime love affair with art in his native New Jersey as a teenager under the tutelage of the late Hungarian master, Geza du Vegh. His development continued at the Leyton School of Art in Milwaukee — simultaneously he pursued an engineering degree at Marquette University. The 1980s found him studying at noted colorist Sergei Bongart's Art School in Los Angeles, focusing on oil painting. Two years there forge the color-driven palette for which he is known today. He has won numerous awards in LA competitions and has filled many commissions for portraiture in the U.S. and abroad, one of which being a recently completed portrait for the Fallen Heroes of Iraq Project.

The Glendale Art Scene

Let's take a look at how the City of Glendale develops civic art and supports the citizens in their art endeavors. It starts with the City of Glendale Arts & Cultural Plan 2013 - 2018. Generated by the Library Arts and Culture staff (Annette Vartanian), the plan was presented to the Arts & Culture Commission (A&CC) at a December 2012 meeting.

At the January 17 A&CC meeting at city hall, the plan was approved and recommended for approval by the City Council. Three GAA members attended this session: Dick Heimbold, Araks Johannes, and Trish Kertes. The City will now formalize the plan plus an additional, more focused work plan by progressing through four city hall meeting milestones:

February 12 – City Council reviews and approves the Arts & Cultural Plan, at the weekly 6pm meeting.

February 14 – A&CC reviews the 2013 - 2014 work plan at a special meeting, 2pm.

February 21 – A&CC recommendation for approval of 2013 - 2014 work plan, 2pm.

To be scheduled – City Council review and approval of 2013 - 2014 work plan.

GAA was asked to comment on the Glendale Arts & Culture Plan in mid-January. We polled our board members and came to the conclusion that this high level strategic plan covered many worthwhile facets of community art — including two areas we are immediately interested in: 1. Acquisition and improvement of real property for displaying Art Work; and, 2. Establishment of a signature arts and cultural event in Glendale.

Glendale artists are often confounded by the lack of exhibition space in Glendale and regard the acquisition of a mid town exhibition capability for display of artwork as <u>high priority</u>. At the January 17th meeting we recommended to the A&CC that there be an immediate fix to take care of the current shortage and a long term fix involving the design and construction of an Art Center — an activity that could span several years.

To address the "event" issue, we recommended that the City put on a yearly art festival or event. It's signature theme would

reflect Glendale's rich and surprisingly varied art resources — digital and film, commercial enterprises, and educational presence, as well as all manner of traditional art forms.

At the meeting, we, the Glendale Art Association representatives, offered to contribute to the work plan in these two areas. On January 24th, draft plans were sent to the A&CC outlining our intentions for both.

An important source of funding for the work plan is the Urban Art Program and Fund that was established in 2010 by City Council Ordinance. The Program requires that private development provide on-site artwork that is equivalent to 2% of the project value, or make an in-lieu payment into the fund equivalent to one percent of the project value. The A&CC's work plan identifies budgets for projects, such as the ones we are recommending, that would be supported by the fund.

I hope this sheds some light on The City of Glendale's art initiatives and how GAA supports and participates in these initiatives. Please note that any GAA member can attend city government meetings to see how art issues are being addressed. More to come next month.

Virginia Romero has been commissioned to illustrate a children's book by the USA Honor Society for writers in Greater LA.




