



SHE WROTE A GRANT, Losses 1: Wins 1

I wanted to try and fund some of my art. Hearing on the internet how easy it is get grant money, I applied my background in writing and applied for a grant (the same one), twice. The first time, I applied I had to construct a budget in Excel complete with income and expenses, and a schedule of work. I had to prepare an Artist Statement, Artist Resume, Artwork JPEG's not to exceed 1920 pixels on any one side, label artwork images with my last name, first name, media, size, year complete, and price, all in the JPEG label (at this point I barely knew what a JPEG was). I had to make 10 copies of the grant application, artwork submissions, and print out a list of my artwork with the above said labeling. I had to attend a workshop for 4 hours on how to write a grant (despite the fact that I had completed one full week of training at the Grantsmanship Center). I had to have written letters of reference, memos of understanding about the various agencies that would cooperate in the grant, and then submit everything on time.

The first time I applied, I turned my grant in a week early and am glad I did. The head of the department called me and asked me to add some things to the grant, which I did in an addendum. By now my grant application was well over 10 pages. And I had spent the best part of two weeks preparing the grant. I waited on pins and needles to learn the outcome of my grant, which took 2 months. I was turned down. I received a summary of the reviews. Most of them were favorable, and one said that this was a great grant. But, one reviewer gave me 2 points out of 100. I thought to myself, my old teachers used to give you 2 points for putting your name on your paper in school. How could I have failed so miserably. I called the head of the department who had asked me to add to my grant. She said she was very sorry, and that the one evaluator they had used gave everyone very low scores. She asked to reapply the next year.

Being an artist, I took this news without a grain of salt and felt like I had wasted 2 weeks. I thought to myself, the City employees get paid whether or not they submit a grant, but an artist loses 2 weeks of work and countless moments of stress over this submission process. I felt like Artists are subjected to a bureaucratic world of paperwork which is contraindicated by the very nature of the independent artist spirit.

But after a year and a few more encouragements from the City, I resubmitted my grant, refurbished the JPEGS, as now they must be no larger than 2MG and completed in the last 2 years. Another few days lost in the world of the Apple Computer. I submitted the grant on the last day of submission, 9 copies about 12 pages each, with CD of images for each copy. Four months later, I hear that I have been accepted. But I did not receive any paperwork for another 3 weeks. Yes, it is true, I am officially accepted. And, yes, they cut my budget in half, then remarked that I had an ambitious project. So as part of the process, I must find an internet donation site (crowdfunding) like Indiegogo or Kickstarter to help fund my project.

I am grateful that I have been selected for the grant, it has taken quite a long time and now there are ever more hurdles. I hear that now, I have to learn how to request the money and attend yet another workshop. Stay tuned!

BEWARE OF ART SCAMMERS ON THE INTERNET

SEVERAL OF OUR MEMBERS HAVE GOTTEN EMAILS FROM PEOPLE WHO CLAIM THEY WANT TO BUY ARTWORKS AND WILL SEND A CHECK FOR THEM. THEIR USUAL PLOY IS TO SEND A CHECK FOR MORE THAN THE AGREED UPON PRICE AND ASK THE ARTIST TO SEND A CHECK OR BANK TRANSFER BACK TO THEM. OF COURSE THE SCAMMER'S CHECK BOUNCES AND THE ARTIST LOSES THE MONEY SENT.
